

RESOLUTION NO. 73-1 - April 3, 1973

WHEREAS, The Union Township believes it to be in their best interest to provide for snowplowing and/or maintaining private access roads;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNION TOWNSHIP that they provide said services in accordance with the following conditions:

In the interest of safety and to minimize damage to private property and highway equipment while snowplowing and/or maintaining private access roads the minimum standards as set forth in the following resolution must be strictly adhered to.

Therefore, be it resolved that:

Requests for snowplowing and/or maintaining any private drives, entrances or access roads will be honored only if the aforesaid driveways meet the minimum requirements of this resolution.

All driveways must have a minimum width of 30 feet at the entrance and 20 foot minimum width throughout the driveway. Said 20 foot width shall be a flat surface and free of stumps, trees, brush, rocks, etc. A minimum height clearance of 13 feet is required. The turn around area shall be not less than 60 feet by 60 feet or an area which meets with the approval of the Road Supervisors or their representative.

The individual requesting the snowplowing and/or maintenance will be required to sign a document releasing the Union Township, its officials and employees, from any or all claims for any damages to property done during said snowplowing and/or maintenance. Said document shall be filed with the Township Chairman.

In the event of a heavy snowfall or extreme drifting conditions, the main traveled roads will be snowplowed before any private drives, entrances or private roads are snowplowed. This determination to be made at the discretion of the Road Supervisors.

All requests for private snowplowing must be made before October 1st of each year. Prior to November 1st the driveway, road or entrance will be inspected by a representative of the Union Township. Upon passing inspection, the release of claim document must be signed and in the possession of the Township Chairman before any snowplowing and/or maintenance can be done by Union Township.

Union Township will not be liable for any costs incurred by the requirements of this resolution.

RELEASE OF CLAIM

In consideration for the snowplowing and/or maintenance work performed by the Union Township, the undersigned hereby agrees to keep the area he designates to be snowplowed free of all property which would be subject to damage by snowplowing equipment.

The undersigned further agrees that Union Township, its officials and employees, will not be held liable for damage to any property encountered in the prescribed area to be snowplowed, as designated by the property owner or occupant of the premises.

SNOWPLOWING RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, THE TOWN OF UNION believes it to be in their best interest to provide for snowplowing private driveways and access roads;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN OF UNION that they provide said services in accordance with the following conditions:

Requests for snowplowing any private drives, entrances or access roads will be honored only if the aforesaid driveways meet the minimum requirements of this resolution.

Said 20 foot width shall be a flat surface and free of stumps, trees, brush, rocks, etc. A minimum height clearance of 13 feet is required. The individual requesting the snowplowing will be required to sign a document releasing the Town of Union, its official and employees, from any or all claims for any damages to property done during said snowplowing. Said document shall be filed with the Town Clerk.

In the event of a heavy snowfall or extreme drifting conditions, the main traveled roads will be snowplowed before any private drives, entrances or private roads are snowplowed. This determination to be made at the discretion of the Road Supervisor.

All requests for private snowplowing must be made before October 1st. of each year. Prior to November 1st. the driveway, road or entrance will be inspected by the Road Supervisor of the Town of Union. Upon passing inspection, the release of claim document must be signed and in the possession of the Town Clerk before any snowplowing can be done by the Town of Union.

The Town of Union will not be liable for any costs incurred by the requirements of this resolution.

RELEASE OF CLAIM

In consideration for the snowplowing performed by the Town of Union, the undersigned hereby agrees to keep the area he designates to be snowplowed free of all property which would be subject to damage by snowplowing equipment.

The undersigned further agrees that the Town of Union, its officials and employees, will not be held liable for damage to any property encountered in the prescribed area to be snowplowed, as designated by the property owner of occupant of the premises.
